'Our' Sienna Sgt's SUGGESTIONS

While patrolling in Sienna and investigating crimes, I am often asked: "How can I help make my community safer?" "How can I help the police solve crimes?" "What should I do if I have evidence of a crime?"

My advice - Look out for your neighbors, be a good witness, and report anything suspicious, and now the Fort Bend County Sheriff's Office has launched a new public safety initiative dubbed as "The real time crime center," I can add: "Register your cameras." Below are a few FAQs on this new program:

Q: Who is this for?

- A: All residential property owners and commercial businesses.
- Q: Does registering my cameras give the Sheriff's Office access to the footage?
- A: No. Video footage can only be accessed if the camera owner authorizes the Sheriff's Office to view (i.e. sends the footage to the officer requesting it).
- Q: Who will know if I am registered or see my video?
- A: Registrant information and any video files provided will be kept confidential and only used in the event of criminal investigation or emergency incident.
- Q: Is there any cost associated with the program?
- A: No
- Q: How long does it take to sign up?
- A: It takes less than a minute to register your information.
- Q: Why would I register my cameras and how I could help?
- A: Here's a great example:

Your neighbor's vehicle was just broken into and burglarized and the suspects have just run from the area. Responding deputies see you are registered with 4 outside cameras. An email and text is sent to you, asking for your assistance to check the cameras and provide suspect information in real time. Due to your quick help, deputies catch the criminals based on your descriptions and video provided. All of the stolen items are returned to your neighbor.
